~*Permaculture is a design system based on ecological principles for creating sustainable human environments* ~ COP21, the UN international climate meeting convened in Paris last year, proved conclusively that our institutions are **not equipped to handle the enormous climate crisis that is facing humanity and our planet on their own.** We need grassroots movements to drive needed transformation - to both demonstrate alternatives to the status quo, and demand that governments, NGOs, and business get on board and work collaboratively as allies for the changes that are so desperately needed.

Permaculture has proven that it has a toolbox of concepts and practices that can be applied virtually anywhere. With

permaculture's inception in the 1970s, it is natural that to continue to evolve and **engage the world** *as it is now*, permaculture may have to go through some transformations of it own, as

we work to understand its strengths and its current limitations. This talk will address emerging perspectives and recent scientific research on permaculture, where we need to go, and how we can get there.

Dr. Rafter Sass Ferguson received his **PhD in Crop Sciences from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 2015**, and is currently a Research Fellow at the **Center for Ecology, Evolution, and Environmental Change at the University of Lisbon**, where he is part of the project Bottom-up Climate Adaptation Strategies Towards a Sustainable Europe. His dissertation research produced the first papers on permaculture to appear in major scientific journals. He has been involved with permaculture as student, educator, and scholar since 2003, and in 2005 developed the Liberation Ecology workshop, a curriculum that helps participants develop strategies for integrating social justice and sustainability goals. The event will be a local celebration of the 7th International Permaculture Day - May 2016

June 18th – Tour of Santa Barbara Moringa Farm at 2pm

The Santa Barbara Moringa Farm, a part of the Dos Pueblos Permaculture Farm was started in 2013 by Fred and Jinger Dixon with support of land owner Rosario Perry as a greenhouse restoration and soil remediation project. It is located at the historic site of the former Dos Pueblos Orchid Company. It has since become a thriving 20 acre working farm with 2.5 acres of perennial food forest, indoor tropical food forest, rescue barnyard, and is home to the SB Moringa Farm, which is our signature commercial crop. Proceeds from the Moringa Farm are used to fund further development of our eco-system rehabilitation project on this beautiful piece of the Gaviota coastline.

Moringa tea will be served; \$5.00 donation to Jinger for her time. There will be Moringa products and possibly plants available for sale. Bring food to spend time and enjoy the property; private beach nearby. Car pool is encouraged leaving at Sears Upper Parking lot at 1:15 or Ride your bike or meet us there: 301 La Casa Grande Circle. 
